Personal Knowledge of Vaccines

 Only remember B.C.G. and Rubella in secondary school, all lined up and vaccinated, consent form signed by parent prior to vaccine.

Vaccine History of Children

 One son, 8 months old, born in Ballinasloe Hospital, routine vaccines to date B.C.G. given in Athlone Health Centre, 5 in 1, Men C at 2, 4 and 6 months in local G.P. surgery.

Introduction to childhood immunisation for my son.

- Reading information during pregnancy myself.
- Antenatal class provided some information.
- Public Health Nurse called after birth, left booklet and advised that I would get appointment in post for B.C.G. Clinic.
- Discussed immunisations myself with G.P. at six week check.
- Postal reminder from H.S.E.

Concerns about immunisations

- No concerns about primary B.C.G., 5 in 1 and Menningitis C immunisations.
- I have some concerns about M.M.R. vaccination, due to publicity in media over the past few years, however, I will research this and discuss with G.P./Practice Nurse prior to immunisation.
- Written information and video are available from H.S.E./G.P. regarding MMR.

Message to parents

- Ask questions, it may be a good idea to write down questions.
- Research vaccines, discuss with G.P./Practice Nurse/friends/parent groups/internet.

Message to Professionals

- Explain what vaccines are and what to expect after vaccines.
- Although I had read, in the booklet, about immunisations I feel it would be a good idea to have this information reinforced on the day ie: reminder about the booklet or new copy if needed, explaining the vaccines, answering frequently asked questions and what to expect after vaccines.
