





Covid-19 Testing A Guide for Deaf and Hard of Hearing people

You may have been feeling unwell, have contacted your GP, and your GP has now referred you for a Covid-19 test. If you are Deaf or Hard of Hearing, the following information may be helpful to note:

- The time and place for your test will be sent to you in a text message.
- The Covid-19 Tester will be wearing a face mask, so if you normally rely on lipreading to communicate, please be aware that this won't be possible during the test.
- You can ask your GP for the test to take place in your home if you feel that communication in the Covid Test Centre will be difficult for you.
- If you are a Deaf sign language user, you can contact the Sign Language Interpreting Service to request ISL interpretation for your Covid-19 Test.
- Before your test, it may be helpful to print this page so you can be aware of the different steps involved in the Covid-19 Test.

Steps involved in a Covid-19 Test in a Test Centre

1.	Use your phone to show the reference number for your test contained in the text
	message
2.	Stay in your car and a healthcare worker will approach you.
3.	You will be given a mask, you will be asked some questions and you will be taken to
	the test centre.
4.	You will be asked to wash your hands properly.
5.	You will be asked for some personal details including your phone number so you
	can be contacted with your results.
6.	You will be asked to blow your nose into a tissue and bin it in a secure bin.
7.	A healthcare worker will use a swab to take a sample from inside your mouth and
	nose.
8.	You can then drive home and remain in self-isolation.

^{*}The steps in a drive-thru test centre are similar to a test centre except you remain in your car for the test.

Steps involved in a Covid-19 Test in your home

1.	A healthcare worker will call to your home with a testing kit.
2.	They will use a swab to take a sample from inside your mouth and nose.
3.	You will be asked for personal details so you can be contacted with your results.
